HOW TO GET THERE



Head South out of Downpatrick on the A25 to Newcastle. One mile past Downpatrick Race Course, turn right for 0.3 miles on the Drumcullan Road. You will find The Mill located on the right hand side.

- By Road:** Belfast is 23 miles from Downpatrick
Dublin is 91 miles
- By Air:** Belfast City Airport is 25 miles
Belfast Int. Airport is 36 miles
- By Sea:** Belfast Harbour is 24 miles
Larne Harbour is 44 miles

RELAX AT THE MILL

WELCOME

Downpatrick, the ancient capital of the Kingdom of Lecale and is closely associated with the Apostle of Ireland. Here in the leafy graveyard of Down Cathedral, with the Mountains of Mourne as a backdrop, lie the mortal remains of St Patrick. A large granite stone marks the grave.



Hidden away in this rolling County Down countryside outside Downpatrick, The Mill at Ballydugan is owned and managed by the Killen Family.

Noel Killen has achieved his childhood dream to own and restore this 18th century flour mill. As a boy he hid a penny in the upper beams in the hope that one day he would be able to buy The Mill. Buy it he did and painstakingly spent 12 years restoring and converting the building into a magical Licensed Country House with a three star Guest House rating.

Silurian Masonry, Oregon pine floors, columns and the original sliding sash windows are just a few of the key architectural features that have been lovingly restored.
